Minutes of Stated Meeting read and approved.

President of Council stated the object of the meeting to be for the purpose of hearing a report from him as Chairman of Police Committee.

He said James Singleton had applied for the office of Policeman; in his judgement this was a better time now than when the weather should be stormy and bad, for appointing ^{one} Mr Wetherill presented several written recommendations in favor of James Singleton.

After much talk over the merits and demerits of the various applicants for Policeman, Thomas Aaron was voted for and received four votes. The President declared him appointed Policeman for the Borough.

Minutes of last Stated Meeting read and approved.

Communication from Policeman Aaron, relating to his salary being paid at stated periods. Lighting lock-up; and asking where to impound road cattle.

Resolution. It was on motion of Mr Castle resolved that a dark-lantern be purchased for the use of Policeman. Thomas Aaron presented a Bill of \$68.10 for 6 ⁷/₃₂ weeks police services. On motion, it was ordered paid.

Resolution Resolved - That the President and Secretary of Council have power to draw an order in favor of Policeman for two weeks salary at the expiration of that time.

Money ordered paid - On Motion an order was drawn in favor of John Spencer for printing and advertising Ordinances \$21.10.

Statement. President of Council said that he had received tax Collector's receipts for the whole amount of tax collected, and inasmuch as the exemptions claimed had by Council been allowed, he had given him back his bond.
