Special Meeting of Upland Borough Council 20 Feb 1872

Members present S. A. Crozer, James Sample, J. L. Crozer and B. Crowther - S. A. Crozer Chief Burgess said the object of the meeting was to take some action by which the spread of small pox should be limited, particularly in regard to the colored persons who come from South Chester Borough for the purpose of washing: The following Ordinance was submitted and enacted,

to prevent-
the spread
of
small pox.
Be it enacted and ordained by authority of the Borough Council of Upland, That while the small pox prevails among the colored people of Chester City and South Chester Borough, it shall not be lawful for them to engage in manner of work in the Borough of Upland.

Any person or persons employing said colored persons to do any work in the Borough of Upland, after ten days' notice of the passage of this Ordinance, shall pay a penalty of five (5) dollars, or suffer imprisonment in the borough lock-up for a period of twenty-four (24) hours.

meeting

A special meeting of Hopland Borough Council was held June 16th 1892. R. H. Crozier in the chair. Members present G. H. Crozier, R. H. Crozier, J. B. Jarman, M. Beck and M. O'Hannan.

Ordinance
considered

G. H. Crozier from street committee, stated that the object of the meeting was to reconsider an ordinance passed at the last meeting of Council. The ordinance provided for ^{the} disposition of all garbage, ashes and refuse of any kind, but owing to a defect in the phraseology, the Chief Burgess, withheld his signature. After some discussion a proviso was inserted covering all objections and the ordinance passed as amended, to wit:-

Ordinance
passed

Be it enacted by the Council of the Borough of Hopland, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that after the passage of this ordinance it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to throw into the public highways within the limits of this Borough, any garbage, ashes or refuse of any kind, but all such shall be deposited in boxes, barrels, or other vessels where it can be hauled away at least twice a week.

Provided this above shall not be understood to prohibit the repairing of side walks with ashes.

Any person or persons violating this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in the sum of one (\$1) dollar or suffer imprisonment in the lock-up for a period not exceeding 48 hours.

Workmen
