Meeting

A special meeting of Council was held June 5th 1893. Members present: G. K. Crozer, R. H. Crozer, A. Castle and W. P. Hannum. The following ordinance was unanimously passed.

Ordinance
relating
to
rabid dogs

Whereas a rabid dog was at large in our Borough last night and has bitten a number of dogs. The safety of the Borough demands that we pass the following ordinance.

Be it enacted by the authority of the town Council of the Borough of Hopland. That after five days from the passage of this ordinance until the 15th day of Sept. next all owners or keepers of dogs or bitches shall be and are hereby required to carefully muzzle each and every dog or bitch in his or her possession.

That all dogs or bitches found running at large during the time specified in the foregoing section within the limits of the Borough of Hopland shall be shot or otherwise destroyed by the policeman.

That the policeman shall be allowed the usual fee of 1 dollar for each and every ~~offense~~ dog or bitch destroyed under the provisions of this ordinance. There being no other business beginning immediate consideration Council adjourned.

On motion Agur Castle was appointed a committee to ascertain the dimensions of Samuel Armable's cart. The President and Secy were authorized to draft an ordinance relating to stray and to report at the next meeting. The Treasurer was authorized to borrow One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) for the use of the Borough.

The Secy called attention of Council to the fact that a number of cattle had been recently impounded and their owners illegally fined as we have no ordinance imposing any fines for stray cattle. On motion the fines were refunded and the policeman allowed \$30 for his trouble. On motion the Secy was authorized to communicate the following resolutions to the Chester City Council. Resolved that the Boro Council of Upland respectfully call attention of the Chester City Council to the deplorable condition of 104th St. between Edgemont Ave and the City line or Ship creek. That inspection is invited to the improvements now finished and in course of construction on said street in the Borough of Upland immediately adjoining the City line, hoping thereby to induce Councils to make the improvement and general repair of said street and to place a street lamp on or near the intersection of said street with the City line.
