Justice Compton handed in a communication from a citizen complaining that Mr Tarry near Kerlin St Bridge kept his shop open on Sundays for the sale of cigars &c he also gave the names of a number of persons whom he had seen coming out of it on Sunday.

On motion referred to the Chief Burgess. Mr Castle asked for information with regard to what action the Chester Street Rail Road had taken on the ordinance granting them the right of way into Upland.

The President reported that there had been no meeting of the Directors of the Company and no action had been taken on it.
