## **Car Cover Ordinance**

The **only** allowable covers are to be either clear, transparent, or have a clear/transparent area allowing the license plate to be visible from the street or sidewalk. Exceptions to the allowable covers will be given to residents who provide current registration, proof of insurance and proof of passed state inspection for said vehicle to be covered within 7 days of inspection to the UPD. Documents will be required on an annual basis. Non-conformance on fully covered vehicles, on public or private property, will be deemed as an "abandoned" vehicle.
