Humane Cat Traps Available for Rent

To assist in trying to address the stray cat population in the borough, Council President Christine Peterson announced that "Cat Traps" are available for loan at the Upland Borough Police Department.

There is a \$50 refundable deposit. This is a convenient & humane way to catch stray cats to be sent to the Brandywine Valley SPCA for processing for possible adoption and/or tagging, neutering, and release if deemed unadoptable.

Upon trapping a targeted stray cat, you MUST contact 911 and the cat with the trap will be picked up. Any wild animals trapped you must release immediately.
