Preliminary 2021 Balanced Budgets

The final adoption of the preliminary budget figures will be held at the Dec. 8th Council Meeting. The real estate tax adjustment (from the current established 2 millage rate) to address the court

ordered reassessment is pending from the county. The annual trash collection fee holds steady at \$135 per household.

The preliminary 2021 general fund budget is balanced at \$4,873,949. This includes new equipment for highway, data terminals and CALEA for the police, renovations and repairs to MacQueen Hall, repairs to the Main Street Wall, as well as a pilot program for composting.


The preliminary 2021 budget for Auburn Village is balanced at \$1,183,560 with rental rates remaining the same.

FOCUS ON UPLAND'S FIRST RESPONDERS

Chief Mike Irey raised in Prospect Park, attended Interboro High School, West Chester University, the DELCO Municipal Police Academy and is a recent graduate of the prestigious Northwestern University School of Police Staff and Command.

Serving as a police officer since 1993, the bulk of his career with Nether Providence Township before coming to Upland Borough in 2014. His 28 year police career, spans various task forces including the DELCO District Attorney's Office Narcotics Task Force acting in an undercover capacity.

He was appointed as the acting police chief in Feb. of 2016 before being officially appointed as permanent Chief in May of 2018. Chief Irey lists amongst his accomplishments, National Night Out to the borough, mobile video records and body worn cameras to foster transparency and trust with the citizens and a variety of school programs fostering positive interactions between the borough police officers and the community.

Chief Irey prefers to be called Mike and the thing he loves most about being UPD's Chief is the opportunity to interact, get to know the people who call Upland Borough home and be given the opportunity to positively influence those lives of the community.
