Trash Removal Hike

"Unfortunately, but not surprising, due to rising prices, our trash contract has risen too. Council has done their due diligence. We put together a trash committee to research our options. We bid & rebid the contract several times, in several different ways, in an effort to get the best possible rates. The new trash fee will be \$235.00 per household, per year. Delaware County has also raised the tonnage rate at the incinerator which will be absorbed by the budget. Please note the new ordinance which will outline the rules governing trash."



Weekly trash removal has also changed. Regular trash will be picked up (unless otherwise indicated due to a holiday) on **Tuesday (one time per** week) from October 1st through April 30th and picked up on Monday and Thursday (two times per week) from May 1st through September 30th.

Recycling will be the Ist & 3rd Friday of each month and Heavy Trash will now be picked up with the regular trash - one item limit per household, per weekly pick up **(Tuesday or Thursday)** and must pre-register by contacting the Borough Office at (610) 874-7317.


Message from President Peterson
