He was a member of American Legion Post 926; Brookhaven Lions Club; life member of South East Police Chief's Association; Delaware County Parks Board; Chester Masonic Lodge #236 F&AM; life member of the Delaware County Fireman's Association. He retired from Crozer Chester Medical Center as Security Director. Mr. McClintock was a U.S Army Veteran.
