
Trash Collection starting in May

CDBG Funds for 2024

At the December 12, 2023 Council Meeting, it was discussed with borough engineer Daniel Archdeacon from Catania Engineering, the planned phase #I Reese Center Renovation for the UBPD.

After a lengthy discussion, it was acknowledged that new plans (including updating air conditioning and heat) will be added into the plan.

Electronic Recycling & Shredding Events

The first semi-annual Electronic Recycling for borough residents is scheduled for Saturday, March 16th from 9 a.m. to noon in the UBPD parking lot.

Also, the first semi-annual Shredding Event for borough residents is scheduled for Saturday, March 23rd from 9 a.m. to noon in the UBPD parking lot.

Main Street Wall Restoration

Work has started to restore the Main Street Wall from 4th Street to Main Street. Funding for this project came from the CDBG from 2022 & 2023.



Borough Council approved at the

November 2023 Council Meeting the lowest bid from Premier Building Restoration in the amount of \$144,595.00.

Work is expected to last through March/April 2024.

New Garage & Yard Sale Ordinance

There was a need to limit, regulate, restrict & control garage & yard sales in the borough.

The only intent is to regulate the terms and frequency of such sales as to **not disturb or disrupt the residential environment**.

Register with the Borough at least 24 hours in advance with name, address, date of sale, phone number, etc.

Limits:

- ♦ No more than 2 per calendar year
- ♦ Duration may not exceed 2 consecutive days
- ♦ Sale of other than personal property prohibited
- ♦ Hours 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Inclement weather will be considered for 3rd day

Always regarded as one of the busier area departments, 2023 saw police officers handle 7675 calls for service including 373 arrests.

Our officers continued their exemplary service to the community and our students with the continuation of our Cops and Kids Program; while officers, including command staff, visit our local schools weekly. Reading to our young community members, providing demonstrations of equipment and our popular K9 officers Halo and Raymond at the direction of K9 Officer Ryan Canzanese.

Our popular bike patrols were again out during the warmer months and will be joined by increased foot patrols in 2024.




